- 6. A flak jacket or flak vest is a form of protective clothing designed to provide protection from shrapnel and other indirect low velocity projectiles. MILITARY HONORS

- Highest military decoration awarded by United States government
- 2. Purple Heart. The Bronze Star is awarded to soldiers for bravery, acts of merit, or meritorious service.
- 3. Memorial Day commemorates US men and women who died in military service. This federal holiday takes place on the last Monday of May. Veterans Day, a federal holiday in November, honors military veterans
- 4. A grave at Arlington Cemetery where the unidentified remains of a soldier are interred.

- The grave is guarded 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It represents a tribute to all the unknown soldiers who have given their lives for our country. The tomb has been guarded every minute of every day since 1937!
- 5. Any active member of the Armed Forces killed during service, the U.S. President, former U.S. Presidents, veterans of the Armed Forces, and former veterans who have received honors such as the Medal of Honor and the Purple Heart.
- 6. A 21-gun salute is fired on the occasion of the arrival or departure of a U.S. President, Foreign Head of State, former U.S. President, or President-elect. A 21-gun salute is also fired at the funeral of a U.S. president and on Memorial Day at Arlington Cemetery in memory of the nation's fallen soldiers. For anyone entitled to a military funeral (those who died on active duty, honorable discharged veterans, and military retirees.) There are three volley shots fired by 7 service men in honor of the deceased veteran. This is commonly mistaken as a "gun-salute" but it is not actually considered a gun, as the shots are fired by rifles, not guns.
